- **CASH ONLY** event. Venmo QR code will be available at the door.
- All individuals not competing in the cook off must be off the premises by **10:00 pm each day**

OUTSIDE FOOD & BEVERAGE

Rules and Regulations | VIOLATIONS OF THESE RULES COULD RESULT IN DISQUALIFICATION AND REMOVAL FROM PROPERTY

• ALL ALCOHOL MUST BE KEPT <u>CONCEALED</u> by all competitors; koozies, stainless steel cups, Styrofoam, etc.

• ALL ALCOHOL MAY enter the premises in a 24" in X 48" Maximum size cooler only. (This is a rule for all persons on the premises, cook teams included. One cooler per vehicle, per day).

• ALL ALCOHOL MUST BE IN A PLASTIC OR ALUMINIM container only. NO GLASS. YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO BRING IN GLASS AND IF ANY COMMITTEE MEMBER ASKS YOU TO DISCARD THEM, YOU WILL BE REMOVED FROM THE PREMISIS IF YOU REFUSE.

- Vendor Fee is \$25

- Space may be inside or outside; prepare for tents and weather appropriately
- Vendors may NOT sell any food or beverages
- Clean up and off premises by 8:00 pm Saturday night

GENERAL REGISTRATION

Rules and Regulations | APPLY TO COMPETITORS

• Cut off for registration is July 1, 2023, or when spots are filled, whichever comes first. All entries must be paid by July 1, 2023. If you register and do not pay by cut-off date your spot will go to the next person on the wait list.

• Anyone visiting on Friday or Saturday **MUST** have a ticket/wristband. Cash at the door. \$5 wrist bands for everyone

BBQ COOK OFF

Rules and Regulations | COOKING AND JUDGING

- \$225 Fee | Jackpots \$25 | 50% payout |Announce top 10 |Top 3 trophies | Grand & Reserve Champions
- Each team must have a head cook and team members can only cook on one team.

• 6:00 pm Head cook must attend the cook off meeting. The head cook is responsible for the operation of the team space and all actions within the designated space by members or their guests.

- Head Cook must be onsite and available to the Royal FFA Parents Club Committee if necessary.
- All sites will be 30 x 30. Additional sites available.
- Each team is allowed ONE vehicle to park in competition area.
- 12:00 6:00 pm, arrival & check in

• Due to the location of the premises & safety of public, <u>BBQ trailers are not permitted leave the grounds during the</u> <u>event</u>; arrival through end of the awards ceremony (approximately Saturday 6:30 pm).

• Due to the location of the premises & safety of public, we would prefer vehicles do not leave the premises between the hours of 11:00 pm – 6:00 am.

• Campers are allowed in designated area. No hook ups available. No waste dumping allowed. Quiet time is effective 11:00 pm – 6:00 am, overnight.

- Team equipment and decorations must fit within the area assigned.
- The Royal FFA Parents Club will only supply teams with space; all other equipment will need to be supplied by cooking teams. All cooking teams must have a fire extinguisher. Electricity and water will not be supplied.
- Fire holes or open pits are prohibited.

• Propane tanks are permitted for heating / starting purposes but will be used at the discretion and responsibility of the team. Pit fires must be wood or wood substance (charcoal). BBQ pits may have gas or electric for start only.

- Please turn off music or turn down to your area at 11:00 pm
- Ice will be available to purchase \$4 per bag, CASH

• ONE 48" X 24" (150 qt cooler) COOLER OF YOUR CHOICE OF BEVERAGES, PER TEAM, PER DAY. Please, do not make us babysit this rule. All alcohol brought in must be brought onto the premises INSIDE the cooler.

• Each team is responsible for cleaning up their area. There will be disposal containers in the cook off area. You will be responsible for discarding your trash in the dumpster.

• All vehicles, trailers, etc. must be removed and your area must be cleaned by Saturday at 10:00 pm



• All entries will be cooked onsite. The preparation and completion of all meats and opens must be done within the confines of the cook off site and during the time limits designated by Royal FFA Parents Club. Once your team and meats arrive at the event, the meats are not allowed to be removed from the competition grounds.



AMERICAN CORNHOLE ASSOCIATION

Court Layout

The following dimensions and measurements will serve to determine how far apart to place cornhole boards as well as positioning of players during game play.

Court Dimensions

A cornhole court shall be a level rectangular area 8-10 feet wide and a minimum of 40-45 feet long. The court should consist of two <u>cornhole boards</u>, designated pitcher's boxes, and foul lines.



Pitcher's Box

The pitcher's box is the rectangle 4 feet by 3 feet at each end of the court, parallel with, and on both sides of the boards. Each player must remain in the pitcher's box while pitching a cornhole bag.

Foul Lines

There are two sets of foul lines: open adult-play and junior-play for children 12 and under. The adult foul lines shall be defined as an imaginary line 27 feet between the front of each board. The junior-play foul lines are defined as an imaginary line 12-15 feet between the front of each board. The foul line should be parallel to the front of the opposite board to meet ACA guidelines.

Play of the Game

Every match is broken down into innings of play. During an inning of play, each player must pitch all four of his/her bags. An inning is never completed until all players pitch all four of his/her bags.

Doubles Cornhole Matches

Two teams, consisting of two players, compete against one another until a winning team is determined.

- Each team will stay in their designated lane for the whole game.
- Players at the headboard will alternate pitching bags until each player has pitched all four of his/her bags.
- Players at the footboard will take score and resume pitching back to the other board.
- The top of an inning is completed when both players pitching from the headboard pitch all four bags; the bottom of the inning is completed when the remaining players pitching from the footboard pitch all four bags.

Scoring

The approved method of scoring for the sport of cornhole is "cancellation" scoring. In cancellation scoring, the points of one player cancel out the points of their opponent. Using this method, only one player/team can score in each inning.

- Bag In-The-Count (Woody) : Any bag which comes to rest anywhere on top of the board. Each is worth one (1) point.
- Bag In-The-Hole (Cornhole) : Any bag which is thrown through the hole or knocked through the hole by another bag. Each is worth three (3) points.
- Foul Bags Refers to any bag that has not been determined as Bag In-The-Count or Bag In-The Hole or was designated a foul bag as the result of rules violation

Determining Winners - Traditional 21

The game shall be played to the predetermined number of twenty-one points. The first player/team to reach (or exceed) that amount at the conclusion of an inning is the winner.



STUDENT COMPETITION

Rules and Regulations | 3 CATEGORIES (FLORAL, WELDING, WOODSHOP)

- Must be a member of FFA
- Turn ins MUST BE ON SITE by Saturday 10:00 AM

• Floral – team of 2, design floral arrangements for a 6 FT table, Wedding reception (1 table runner & votive candles are allowed. The judging will be based on FLORAL arrangements)

• Welding – team of 2, create any functional firepit, BBQ barrel, other like items. Must NOT BE LARGER than the dimensions of 6 ft length, 6 ft height, 6 ft width.

• Woodshop – team of 2, create any functional rocking chair, outdoor bench, other seating items. Must NOT BE LARGER than the dimensions of 6 ft length, 6 ft height, 6 ft width.

• Judging – will be based on 50 points, decimals are allowed to determine placing. Judging will be based on these categories, Creativity, functionality, quality, appeal, & sale probability.

- Winner's 1st, 2nd, 3rd, will be announced and given monetary awards at the awards ceremony, Saturday 5:30 PM
- Clean up and off premises by 10:00 pm Saturday night
